THE IMPACT

the TOOL LIBRARY

The Tool Library's brick and mortar storefront located at 5 W. Northrup Place in Buffalo's University Heights serves over 1,100 active members from across WNY. Members include renters. homeowners, small businesses, community organizations, and other nonprofits. Memberships start as low as \$30/year and allows members to borrow tools for up to a week at a time.

By prioritizing access over ownership, and creating a collectively held resource or "commons", The Tool Library represents a new way to fight inequalities in our communities. Through its work over the past decade, The Tool Library is demonstrating that a collective way of sharing, accessing, and using resources is not only possible, but urgent and necessary.

Through its **Spring and Fall Service Days**, The Tool Library partners with over a dozen community organizations to put its tools to work improving shared spaces. These events bring together community members, teach new hands-on skills, and help steward public spaces like parks, gardens, and trails.

More than just picking up trash or planting a tree, Service Days at The Tool Library are about reconnecting neighbors, harnessing the power of collective action to address quality of life issues, and building a culture of stewardship over the spaces we share. These events bring together hundreds of volunteers each year and have helped catalyze significant public investments along the North Buffalo Rail Trail, Tyler Street, Main Street, and Bailey Avenue.

Dare to Repair Cafes are pop-up community events where individuals can bring broken items and work with a team of volunteer fixers to try to repair the item for free. Dare to Repair not only helps people save money and keep items in circulation and out of landfills, but also teaches basic repair skills.

As current recycling technologies reach their limits of usefulness, repairing the things we own has become an increasingly important solution to addressing the challenge of the growing global waste stream.

Repair Cafes connect highly skilled volunteer fixers to individuals with broken items and, through hands-on instruction and troubleshooting, teach people the value, ease, and sense of accomplishment repair can bring.


The rainbow bench on Main Street in University Heights gets some love and a fresh coat of paint from Tool Library volunteers.

Welcoming Our First Staff Member, Lissa!

What started as a dream to raise \$10,000 to celebrate ten years of borrowing and building, 2021's 10th Anniversary Capital Campaign raised \$74,858 thanks to the gifts from so many of you who believe in what we do and a \$25,000 challenge grant from the John R. Oishei Foundation.

This funding allowed The Tool Library to hire our first staff member, Malissa (Lissa) Rhodes as Operations Manager. Lissa comes to us from Northwood Historic Restoration, where, as a carpenter's apprentice, she learned the ins and outs of repairing and rebuilding historic windows. Her knowledge of carpentry and the skilled trades comes as a graduate from the Assembly House 150 SACRA program.

Over the past year, Lissa has been instrumental in streamlining shop operations, training and building relationships with volunteers, providing project help to members and walking them through our 4,000+ tools, building new partnerships, and reorganizing our increasingly space-challenged storefront.

Seeing is believing! The Tool Library supports low-cost, highimpact neighborhood improvement and beautification projects that are transforming Buffalo's University District, as well as other communities across the city and Western New York. By providing residents and organizations affordable access to tools, it becomes easier to turn ideas for change into on the ground action.

The Tool Library's Fall and Spring Service Days are an opportunity to put our tools to work transforming the spaces we share into the places we love.

The Tool Library hosted 12 Service Days over the course of 2022. Working with over 17 community partners, our volunteers stewarded parks, trails, and community gardens such as the Tyler Street Community Garden, Bailey-Dartmouth Community Garden, the North Buffalo Rail Trail, William Gaiter Parkway Walking and Biking Trail, Dewey Park, and Perkins Park.

New in 2022 was a Request for Proposals as part of our Spring Service Days. We asked community partners to nominate a project that needs extra hands (and tools). We received over half a dozen applications from organizations and ultimately chose to work with the Resource Council of WNY beautifying the planters in front of their building and stewarding the adjacent Perkins Park.



We Encourage Repairing Through Dare to Repair

According to recent estimates, Americans generate an average of **254 million tons of trash** each year.

Started in 2017 thanks to a partnership with the City of Buffalo Department of Recycling, Dare to Repair Cafes are The Tool Library's take on the global Repair Cafe movement. Conceived as a way to rethink waste and transform our throw-away economy, the Repair Cafe model is helping to rekindle a culture of fixing the things we own.

Repair Cafes connect highly skilled volunteer fixers to individuals with broken items and, through hands-on instruction and troubleshooting, teach people the value, ease, and sense of accomplishment repair can bring. Small shifts in our thinking and habits can have a huge impact on one of our world's most pressing challenges.

Dare to Repair Cafes are a tangible, hands-on example of how the circular economy can help reduce waste, save money, and promote greater economic equality.

After a several year hiatus following the pandemic, Dare to Repair Cafes returned in 2022, with a total of four events, hosted by schools, libraries, and community centers across Western New York. 145 people attended these events, with 79 items being successfully fixed, 889lbs of potential waste diverted from landfills, and \$5,187 saved on replacement costs.

Time Commitment: 5 - 15 hours/month

Are you interested in getting more involved with The Tool Library?

Below are some of the opportunities we have available. Want to contribute in a different way? Please reach out!

Our tool librarians are the face of the Tool Library. This role is for folks interested in working on-site at the library and helping visitors. You would learn how to open and close the library, check tools in and out, assist visitors with finding tools, signing up for memberships, and more. You don't need to be a tool expert, but if you're a kind, helpful, adaptable, decision-maker you'd be great! Ideally these volunteers are able to commit to a regular weekly or bi-weekly schedule to help us staff the library.

TOOL FIXER Time Commitment: 5 - 10 hours/month	Calling all tool geeks and tinkerers! Our volunteer repair team helps assess, maintain, and repair the tools in our inventory. Are you skilled or interested in tasks like these: Blade sharpening, small motor repairs, wiring and electrical, tool cleaning and de-rusting? Then you might just be the fixer we've been looking for!
WORKSHOP LEADER Time Commitment: 5 hours/month	Do you enjoy teaching people new skills? Do you gain satisfaction from empowering others to do for themselves? Then you might be the perfect person to lead a DIY workshop at The Tool Library! One of our most requested programs by members, we are looking for individuals who are willing to lend their talents to lead workshops ranging from how to reglaze windows and repair plaster to tiling a backsplash or swapping out a light fixture and everything in between!
BOARD MEMBER Time Commitment: 10 - 20 hours/month	As a volunteer-powered organization, board members are a critical part of furthering the mission and implementing the vision of The Tool Library. Tasked with developing the strategic direction for the organization, maintaining financial oversight, and identifying programmatic priorities, the board meets monthly and also self-organizes committee meetings to democratize decision-making.
COMMITTEE MEMBER Time Commitment: 5 - 10 hours/month	Committees are one of our most important tools in turning ideas into action. Consisting of Development, Finance, Governance, Programs, Operations, and Spatial Planning, each committee is chaired by a board member and has open membership. Those with a particular skill or passion are highly encouraged to join a committee prior to becoming a board member.

5 - 10 hours/month
